

'The Art of Podcasting: Telling Stories in Sound', with Karthik Nagaraj, that took place on August 5 2020, marked the commencement of the series of workshops for students as a part of Media Meet, an initiative by the Department of Media Studies of CHRIST (Deemed to be University). The host of the Filter Koffee podcast and the Chief Content Officer for Wavemaker, Karthik Nagaraj is also a screenwriter and an independent film-maker. Apart from this, he is a visiting faculty across various business schools as well.

"Having an opinion is the major prerequisite while hosting a podcast," Karthik said while he stressed about the necessities and qualities one should have to host a podcast. Various other aspects like creativity, different types of podcasters and technology were also discussed. He also spoke about podcasting in the context of journalism.

From the history of podcasting to its status in contemporary times, he detailed various aspects. While highlighting the emerging technological innovations, he said that rather than listening to podcasts, more people are hosting it. The accessibility of the content and commercial viability of podcasts was put into focus.

The different perceptions and point of views from the side of the host and the listener of a podcast were widely discussed. Rather than defining the idea theoretically, he posed examples of a few great podcasts, suggested self-publishing platforms and put forth ideas for promoting their shows. "Listening to podcasts is an intimate experience. Natural sounds add sensory layers into it and elevate the show," he said.



The workshop was more of an interactive session, where the virtual stage was open for any questions and queries from the audience. While answering the questions from his personal experience, he provided a learning experience for the students.

The resource person focused on how podcasting in India helped some people to open up about their relationships and supported the LGBTQ+ community. The workshop ended with a question-answer session and the vote of thanks.
