


Event Name: Legal Awareness Workshop for Housekeeping Staff.




PROJECT AMRIT: water body clean up drive with sant nirankari charitable foundation




Participants learned about proper waste disposal methods, the impact of pollution on natural resources, and the importance of individual responsibility in preserving the environment.


























Impact on Students:
