ABSTRACT

This project attempts to examine the media infrastructure and the use of mobile phones and/or other media technologies by migrants in the city of Bengaluru, Karnataka, India. It intends to observe how emerging advancements in information and communication technologies (ICTs) and the subsequent opportunities created by advancements in mobile media technologies are being used by migrant communities to reformulate the media discourse to become producers of their own symbolic spaces. It closely looks into the lived experiences and social infrastructures that motivate migrant workers in the changing urban landscape of India, to adopt, use and share the kind of mobile media content they chance upon every day in their informal work settings.

The results of the study, gathered using ethnographic methods such as unstructured/semi-structured interviews and participant observation, can be helpful to make key policy recommendations regarding the importance of educating migrant workers about the safe access and usage of valuable mobile media applications.
