INAUGURATION

The event was inaugurated by Chief Guest Mr. SP Shankar, Senior Advocate, High Court of Karnataka, Guest of Honour Dr. Anil Pinto, Registrar, CHRIST and Dr. J Kennedy, Head of Department, Department of Humanities and Social Sciences, CHRIST with brief remarks on the importance of Constitution and its influence in day-to-day lives.

STRUCTURE

Preamble, Citizenship, Federal Form of Government, Fundamental Rights, Directive Principles of State Policy, Separation of Powers, Judiciary, Executive, Legislature, Doctrine of Basic Structure, Emergency.
