Matters on the Agenda

2. To consider and recommend the change in curriculum for Degree Programme The Board of Studies reviewed the proposed changes in curriculum for:


New syllabus for English, Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course, First year 2016 batch was discussed and approved by the board. The experts suggested to mention the details of all the skills that will be imparted in the syllabi.

New syllabus for Additional English, Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course, First year 2016 batch was discussed and approved by the board. The board suggested to consider the title of the textbook as Voices from South Asia for the text book.

New syllabus for Alternative English, Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course, second year 2015 batch was discussed and approved by the board.

The second year papers for BA Honours in English for the academic year 2016-17 ENGH301 Basics of Editing, ENGH302, American Literature, ENGH303 Research Writing, ENGH304 Literary Criticism, ENGH401 Content Writing, ENGH402 Critical Theory, ENGH403 Introduction to Linguistics, ENGH404 Reading Children's Literature were tabled for discussion.

The experts cautioned to be aware of implications of offering skill enhancement papers on Basics of Editing and Content Writing. Teaching these papers should come from experts who have work experience in the publishing industry along with other new media industry. So the board decided to have regular guest lectures/workshops for students along with few Faculty Development Programmes to equip the faculty members to teach these courses.



ENGH204 Reading Poetry as Discipline Specific Elective has been introduced to the Second Semester for Batch2016 instead of Indian Writing in English. The experts felt that a list of poems that could be used in class should be included in the syllabi.

The experts suggested including Beginning Theory by Peter Barry as recommended reading ENGH402 Critical Theory.

Syllabus for English Studies, MA in English with Communication Studies, MPhil in English and Generic Electives were ratified.

To consider and approve the Generic Electives, Skill Enhancement, Non-Core Elective courses, offered to other departments

The Board considered the proposed Certificate Programme in Reading and Writing for Academic Purposes as per details given in Annexure D of the Notice and approved the same. The Board appreciated the value adding benefits of the Programme.

4. To consider and approve testing pattern for the courses shifting to Bannerghatta

The proposal to revise the CIA component to 70% as against the current 50%, for the courses shifting to Bannerghatta Campus(BA Honours in English, EPH, MEP, BBA Tourism) was discussed and approved

5. To consider any other matter with the permission of the Chair

With no other matters to discuss the Chairperson adjourned the meeting thanking all the participants. The Chairperson thanked Dr Shantha V and Dr. Siraj Ahmed for their presence and valuable suggestions.
