About the workshop

Parapsychology is a branch of Psychology which is defined as the ‘phenomena transcending sensory motor limitations’. Scientific study of the so-called supernatural phenomena is said to have commenced from 1882, with the founding of the society for Physical Research in London. The term parapsychology has been popularized by Dr. J B Rhine of the Duke University, USA. The Parapsychology Laboratory was established at Duke University in 1934. American Association for the Advancement of Science has accepted Parapsychology in December 1969. Many suggest that it's not a valid science, since it is contrary to common sense. However, the number of psychologists believing that the existence of genuine parapsychological phenomena exists has increased in recent times. Parapsychology is concerned with the investigation of paranormal and psychic phenomena which include telepathy, precognition, clairvoyance, psychokinesis, near-death experiences, reincarnation, apparitional experiences, and other paranormal claims. The workshop provides brief introduction to these entire phenomenon.
