

Guidelines and policies for conducting practical classes.

Conducting classes

1. Comfortable masks are a must for students and faculty.
2. Faculty checks the body temperature of the students before they enter the room.
3. Faculty checks that the students applying sanitizer before they enter the room.
4. A class is divided into batches that don't exceed ten people in each to maintain social distance.
5. One classroom could be used by only one batch per day.
6. Windows have to be open for better ventilation.
7. For PEP and TEP, preferably to use open spaces like the 10th floor of CB or the Audi block's basement.
8. For those students who aren't coming to the campus, practical classes will be conducted online. (Online classes begin on 4th of January)
9. During a practical class after each 20 mins will be 5 mins break which students spend on social distance from each other.
10. All musical instruments need to be sanitized.
11. PEP and TEP start Practical classes on the campus from 15th January for third years and 25th January for first and second years.
12. MPE Piano Practical classes on the campus start from 22nd February for third years and 2nd march for first and second years.
13. MPE Vocal Practical classes on the campus start from 4th January for third years; 18th January for second years and 1st February for first years.
14. TEP, PEP, MPE will conduct practical classes offline and online for the 1st years on Wednesday, 2nd years on Tuesday and Friday, 3rd years on Monday and Thursday.
15. MPE will need to have regular weekly use of KE Auditorium for particular time tabled classes.

Timing

1. Online classes will be scheduled in the morning and practical classes on the campus in the afternoon from Monday to Friday, 2pm-4pm to avoid:
 - a) Students commute during morning rush hour with lots of people.
 - b) Students consume lunch on the campus together, breaking social distance.

Consent

1. The students are informed that having classes on the campus is voluntary.
2. Those who are willing to have practical classes on the campus need to sign a consent form where they state if they contract a virus, it's their entire responsibility, and the University can't be blamed.

3. If the students decide to come to campus for the practical classes then they cannot revert back to online classes as it will be difficult for the faculty to organize the classes if students keep switching back and forth.
4. Guardians of students need to be informed by the University.
5. Those students who are coming to Bangalore need to quarantine 7 days at home after arrival.
6. The students need to take a COVID-19 test before they attending classes and provide the certificate.
7. For the faculty taking classes on the campus is also voluntarily.
