
Synopsis of the Activity (Description)

The recruitment process provided a comprehensive platform for students, featuring both on-campus and off-campus opportunities, enabling them to connect with various schools and educational organisations.


Sixty students from the School of education have been successfully placed; the total number of schools the students have been placed in is 30, and the names of the schools are:

The above pie chart displays the distribution of placements for the academic year 2023-2024 across different educational boards.

- ICSE (48.3%): Most placements (48.3%) were in institutions that follow the ICSE curriculum, indicating a strong preference or demand for teachers trained under this system.
- **CBSE** (38.3%): Most placements (38.3%) were in schools that follow the CBSE curriculum. This suggests that CBSE schools are also a major destination for graduates from the placement drive.
- State (10.0%): A smaller proportion of placements (10%) were in state board schools, indicating that fewer students were placed in state board institutions than ICSE or CBSE schools.
- **IB and Cambridge (1.7% each)**: Both the International Baccalaureate (IB) and Cambridge systems received the lowest percentage of placements (1.7% each). While these boards offer global opportunities, the number of placements in these schools is relatively low compared to other educational boards.



This pie chart displays the percentage distribution of students across various educational boards.

- **ICSE**: 47.2% Most students are placed in the ICSE board.
- **CBSE**: 38.0% The second largest group of students follow the CBSE curriculum.
- **State**: 9.9% A smaller segment of students are in the State board.
- **IB**: 3.3% A small percentage of students are in the International Baccalaureate (IB) board.
- **Cambridge**: 1.6% The smallest group of students are in the Cambridge board.

The placement drive for the academic year 2023-2024 offered our graduates a range of salary packages, reflecting the diverse roles and responsibilities available within the educational sector. The **highest salary package** secured by a candidate was **Rs.** 53,000 per month, showcasing the value placed on skilled educators by leading institutions. Conversely, the **lowest salary package** offered was **Rs.** 25,000 per month. The **average salary** across all placements stood at **Rs.** 35,694 per month, indicating a competitive and rewarding remuneration for our graduates entering the teaching profession.

The **on-campus** placement had **16 schools**. These schools offered positions across various roles, catering to students with different skills and aspirations. The structured process of on-campus recruitment provided students an invaluable opportunity to engage with recruiters directly, showcase their talents, and secure rewarding positions within renowned institutions.

In addition to the on-campus placements, this year also saw significant **off-campus recruitment**, There were **63 schools** involved, further expanding the opportunities available to students. Several schools, both within the city and beyond, reached out to our institution for off-campus recruitment, recognising the calibre and potential of our students. This extended placement process allowed students greater flexibility in choosing schools that align with their professional goals and teaching philosophies
