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
Executive Summary

Since the inception of the program in the month of May 2019 as a collaboration between Sambhav Foundation and a leading financial institution, a team was set up and assigned the task of mobilizing, enrolling and starting coursework for candidates in two trades. The two trades, Certificate Course for Sewing Machine Operator (SMO) and Domestic Data Entry Operator (DEO) then started in the month of July and September respectively.

Thirty six candidates started receiving training from the 29th of July 2019 for the Certificate Course for Sewing Machine Operator in two batches of 18 each. The program for Domestic Data Entry Operator however started on the 30th of September 2019 with a total enrollment of 58 candidates. Both programs till the end of December witnessed a total of 120 Candidates benefit from the training over a span of 7 months and 6 batches.

A total of 55 candidates out of 62 who enrolled for the Certificate Course for Sewing Machine Operator were assessed and certified. Although the assessment is yet to happen for the candidates who enrolled for the Data Entry Operator program, 6 candidates who cleared the assessment for Sewing Machine Operator have got jobs.

Location Overview



Hosur

Hosur is an Industrial City in the Indian state of Tamil Nadu. It is located on the bank of the river Ponnaiyar, 35 kilometres (22 mi) South-East of Bengaluru and 306 kilometres (190 mi) west of Chennai, the state capital. Hosur is a satellite city of and the gateway to Bengaluru from Tamil Nadu. With over 200,000 population it is an industrial hub and houses several automobile and manufacturing industries.



Introduction

Sambhav Foundation

Sambhav Foundation is a not-for-profit organization working for social justice and empowerment of the weaker section of the society. It is registered under Society Registration Act, 1860 and Bombay Public Trust Act, 1950. It is also FCRA registered and any contribution made to the organization, is tax deductible under ATG. As a social organization, it has a deep-rooted goal to bring about a change in the lives of deprived communities through people's organization and capacity building. It has been actively involved in the awareness activities for weaker communities. It not only conducts educational activities for children under difficult circumstances and street children through non formal education but also trains unskilled workers for their skill development and livelihood generation.



Project Summary

The program funded by a leading financial institution and implemented by Sambhav Foundation was an initiative aimed at imparting skills to 100 women to enable them a sustainable livelihood. The program was started at Hosur, Tamil Nadu. the program began by setting up a team to mobilize candidates, counsel them, find out their interest in taking up the courses, create batches for training, carry out the coursework, assess the candidates thereby enable women candidates create their own self sustained livelihood.

Goals/Objectives

- Provide skill training to 100 women
- Train 50 Women to become Sewing Machine Operators
- Train 50 Women to become Data Entry Operators
- Conduct interactive and vocational training
- Prepare training modules
- Provide work/market linkages
- Carry out assessment of candidates.

The process of mobilization started in the month of June 2019. Self Help Groups (SHG's), village panchayats, local women influencers around the locality were contacted to explain the need and benefits of the program. The above channels then mobilized women in batches in various locations. The mobilized candidates were counselled about the courses and its benefits through a presentation. The candidates thus mobilized were then based on their interest and willingness to join the program registered. A total of 62 candidates were mobilized and registered for the SMO course and a total of 58 candidates for the DEO course.



The Program


The project started on the 29th of July 2019 with the Certificate Course for Sewing Machine Operator. Two batches were set up with 18 candidates each. Two more batches for Sewing Machine Operator started on the 23rd of September with a total of 26 candidates.

Beginning from introducing the apparel industry to imbibing market information management among the candidates, the program offers more than 85 hours of hands on experience based learning. The course offers training on aspects such as drafting and cutting the fabric, sewing for dress material, maintaining health and safety in the workplace, complying with industry regulations and much more.

Batches for Domestic Data Entry Operator started on the 29th of September 2019 with a total of 58 candidates. The candidates were enrolled in two separate batches of 29 candidates each.


The program offers more than 100 hours of practical learning out of 200 total sessions. The program enables the candidates in understanding data entry completely by delivering sessions including communication skills, operating systems, storing and extracting data, networking, money management and much more.

Age Profile

Out of the 120 candidates who enrolled during the quarter majority (42) of the candidates belonged to the age category of 21 - 23 and the second majority (30) belonged to the age category between 18 - 20. The graph above shows the detailed age distribution of the candidates enrolled in detail.




Caste Profile

89 candidates enrolled during the quarter belonged to Other Backward Castes (OBC) constituting an approximate 74% of the total enrollments.


Educational Background

From a total of 62 candidates enrolled for the Certificate Course for Sewing Machine Operator 55 candidates attended the assessment and were certified accounting to 88% of total enrollment. 7 candidates however dropped out of the course and thus did not attend the assessment process.

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
Quality Assurance
