ABSTRACT

The graphic novel landscape in India has witnessed a significant change with innovative and revolutionary ideas. The new age writers of the graphic novel express divergent attitudes towards social and cultural issues realising how images possess a shaping force over how identities are performed and understood. However, both the literary and academic realms sometimes fail to acknowledge the obvious agency in the graphic narratives that break conventions and engage in narratives and visual art that might raise the stature of this medium from 'low' art towards a renewed glocal identity. This research is an attempt to study narratives by two Indian graphic authors who integrate image and text to explore cultural complexities and societal constructs of the millennial age by subverting the conventional approach of narratology in the graphic medium by adopting postmodern literary conventions.

Appupen and Amruta Patil through their narratological techniques aim at a critically enhanced reading of graphic narratives by adopting a complex visual-verbal rhetoric. The research aims at a critical discourse analysis of the works of the two graphic artists mentioned, through the lens of semiotic theory as proposed by Roland Barthes to unravel the alternate mythical realities that the narratives propose, gender representations in retellings through the gender theories of Judith Butler and masculinity studies of Raewyn Connell. The research also will aim at an inquiry into innovative narratological techniques in the visual verbal medium as propounded Scott McCloud. The study of these narratives under the postmodern lens critically examines the specific conventions, intertextual elements and so forth that subvert linearity of graphic aesthetic experience and thereby establish these texts as 'glocal' in nature and representative of artificial or alternate myth builders of the millennial age.
