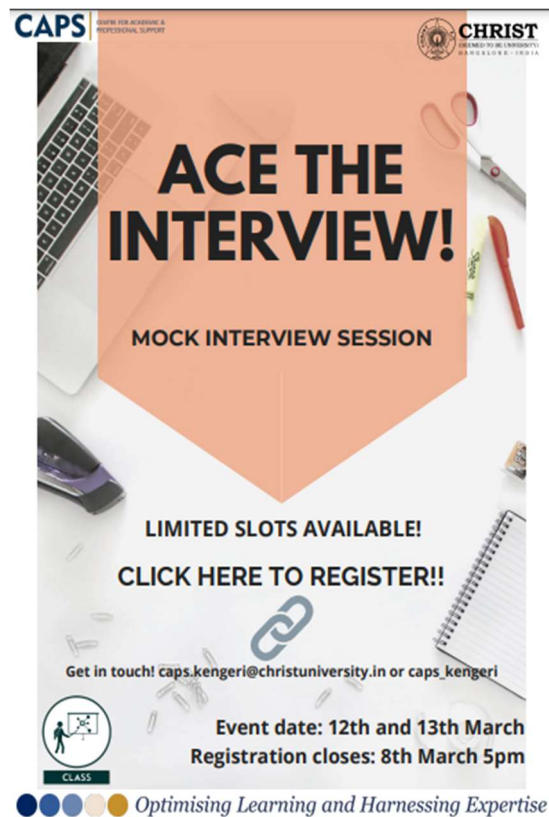

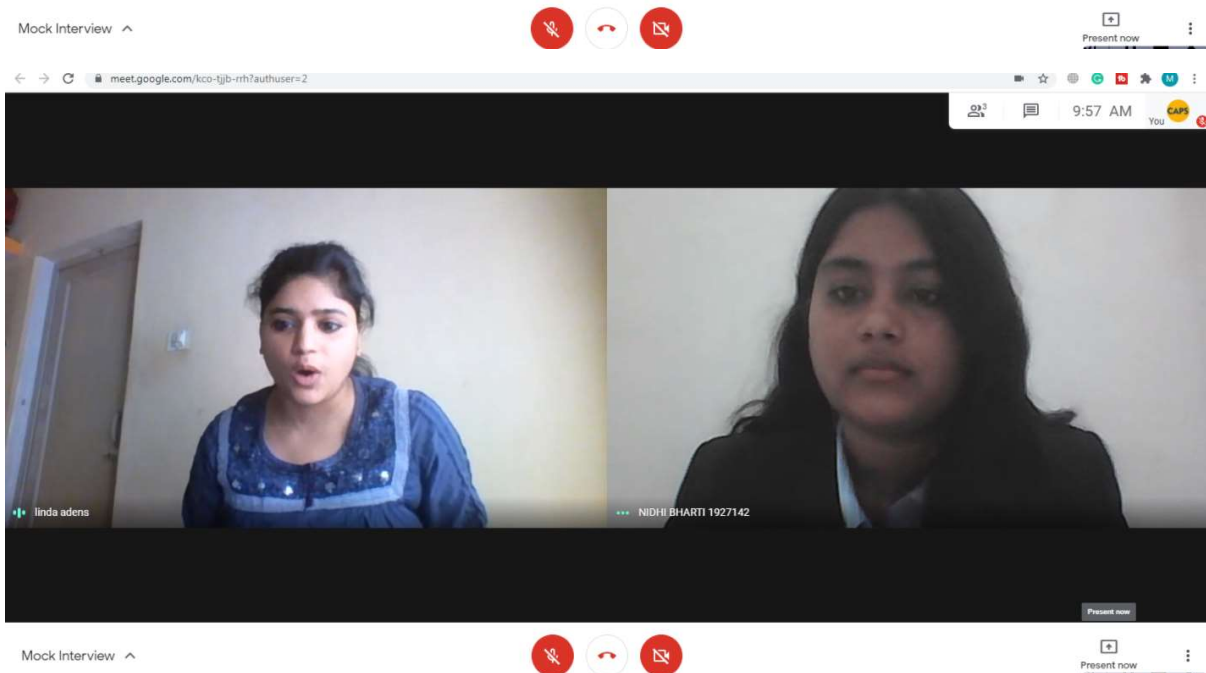
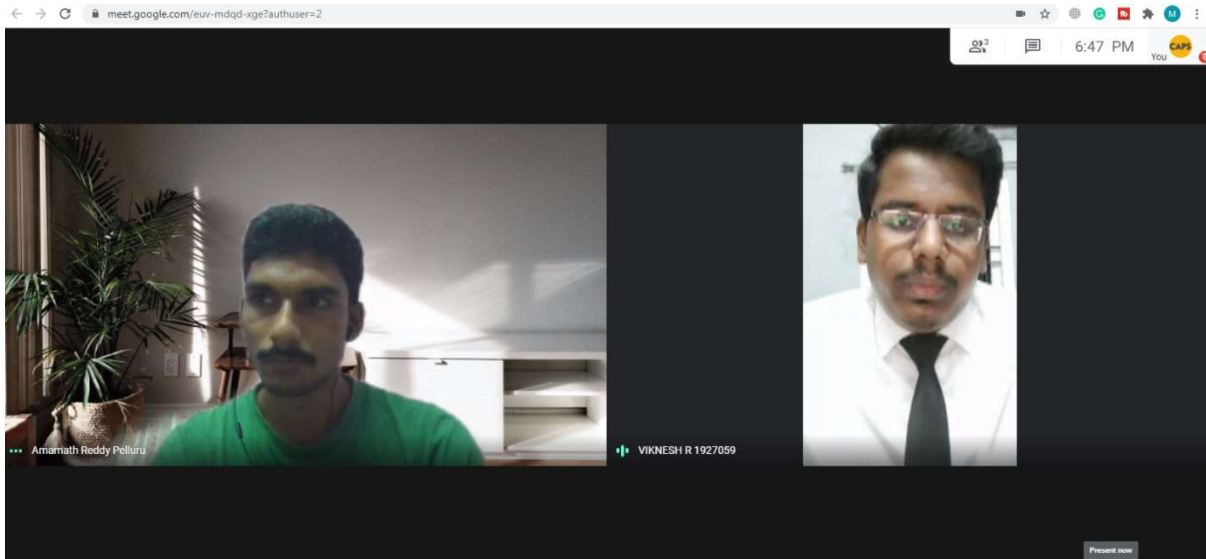
With one month remaining to sit for placement and internship interviews, lot of students were having anxiety at the last hour. We thought of arranging a platform where students can interact with alumni from same specialization having industry experience, to discuss interview and resume related problems and boost their self-confidence and work on areas needing improvement to crack upcoming interviews.

One week prior to the event, MBA student registration form was circulated through mail to collect student details and resume. We had a seat limit of 30 to handle limitation of alumni availability but we received 33 registrations and successfully handled the additional demand. Based on alumni and candidate availability, CAPS volunteers from MBA department meticulously arranged slot for each candidate. With help of CAPS-PR team, we have prepared a candidate evaluation template to enable the interviewer to correctly analyse the candidate's internal strengths and weaknesses in relation to external opportunities and threats. One day prior to the event, resume and candidate evaluation-SWOT template were shared with the interviewer so that candidate can have a smooth mock interview experience on the event day.

Each candidate was allotted 20-30mins time slot to undertake the one-on-one mock interview session. At end of the interview, candidate evaluation was collected from the interviewer.

After the event thankyou certificates were shared with the alumni and a SWOT evaluation feedback was shared with the candidate. We received positive feedback regarding the event's idea and operation from both candidates and alumni. Below enclosed are few snapshots of the event and feedback from stakeholders.

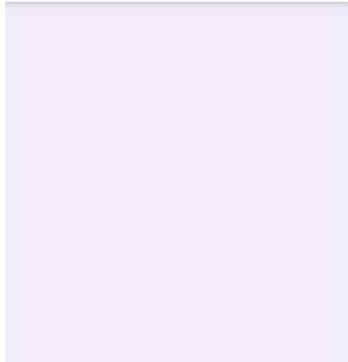

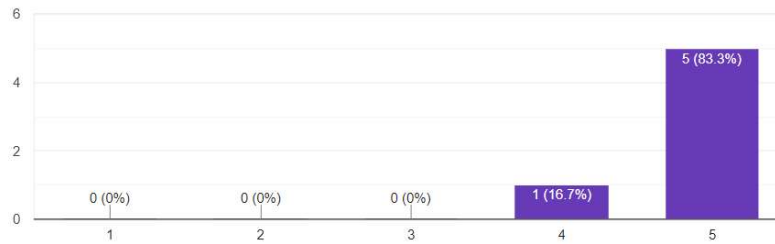

Were the CAPS volunteers helpful

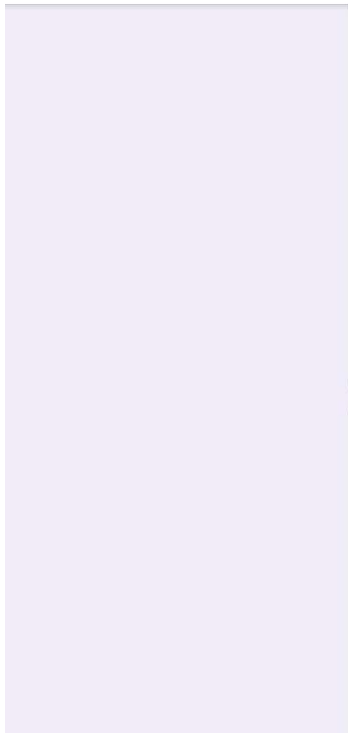

MBA Mock Interview <12/03/2021 - 13/03/2021> Feedback form

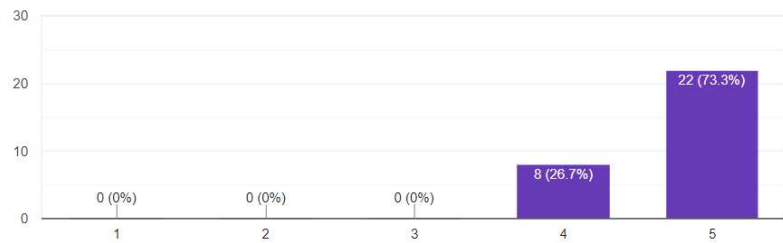

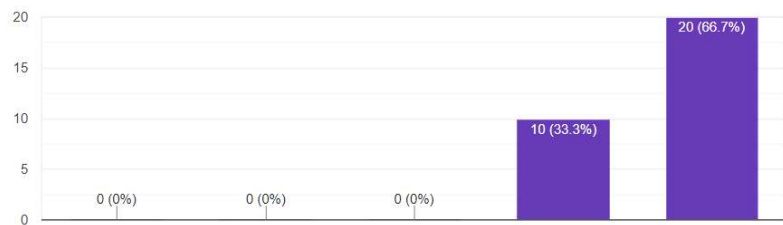
How satisfied are you with the Event?

How relevant and helpful do you think it was for you?

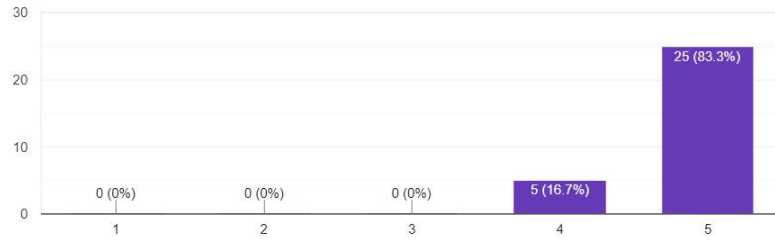
