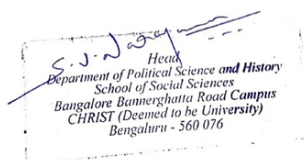

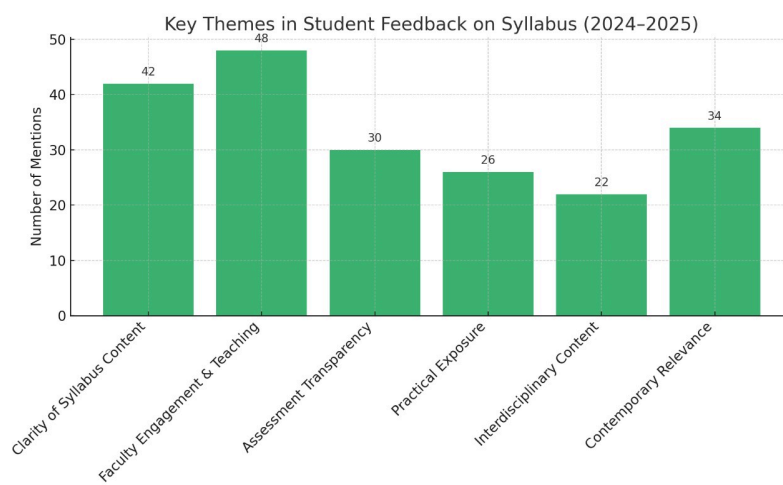
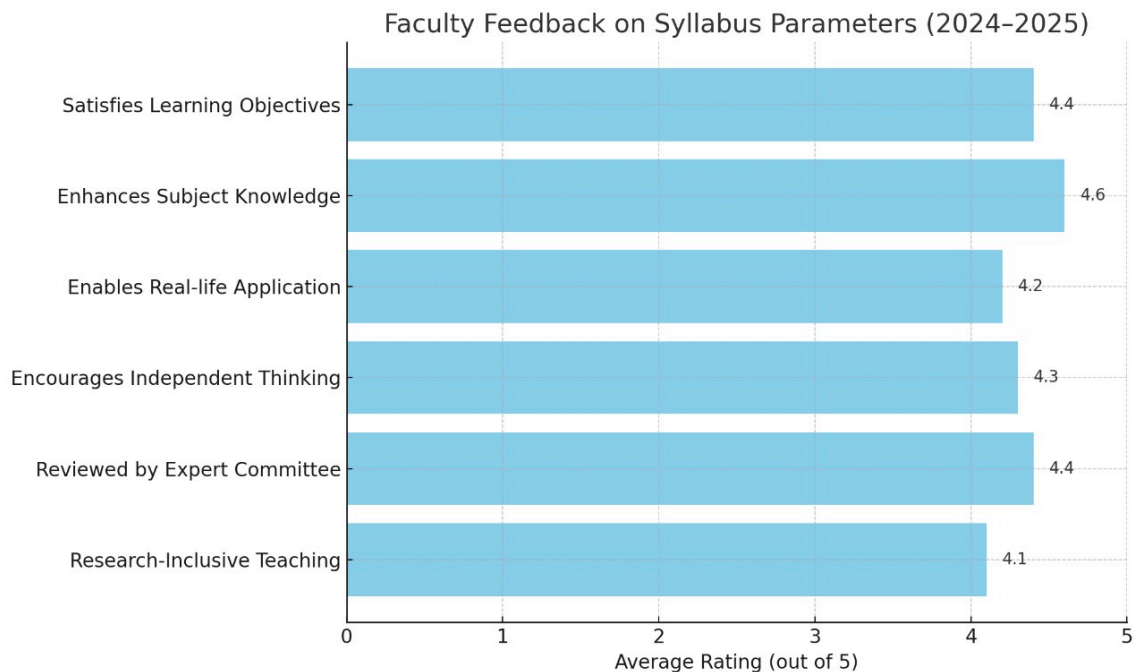

Feedback Analysis

As part of the structured feedback process under Metric 1.4.1, inputs were collected from both students and faculty members at the Bannerghatta Road Campus for the academic year 2024–2025. Feedback focused on the syllabus across undergraduate programmes offered by the Department of International Studies, Political Science, and History. Student responses indicated overall satisfaction with the clarity, structure, and academic value of the syllabus. They appreciated the relevance of course content and the interactive classroom environment. However, several students suggested the inclusion of



more contemporary examples, interdisciplinary linkages, and clearer alignment between the syllabus and the internal evaluation system. Faculty feedback, recorded through a structured rating system, reflected broad agreement that the syllabus met its stated learning objectives and promoted independent thinking and applied understanding. Faculty also confirmed the presence of regular review mechanisms and acknowledged the syllabus's ability to support research-inclusive teaching practices. Most feedback across parameters such as relevance, effectiveness, and real-world application was rated as "Good" to "Excellent," indicating a positive reception with constructive suggestions for academic enhancement.



Feedback Action taken

In response to the feedback received from students and faculty regarding the syllabus and curriculum structure, the Department of International Studies, Political Science, and History at the Bannerghatta Road Campus has initiated steps to enhance academic exposure, practical engagement, and research opportunities for students. The feedback analysis highlighted the need for increased interdisciplinary content, improved clarity in evaluation methods, and greater opportunities for applying theoretical knowledge in real-world contexts.

To address these areas, the department is currently in active discussions with a range of academic and professional organizations. One of the major initiatives under consideration is a partnership with the **University of Turin**, aimed at facilitating **student and faculty exchange programmes** as well as **collaborative academic research**. This initiative is intended to promote international academic exposure and integrate global perspectives into the curriculum.

Additionally, the department is pursuing **research and internship collaborations** with the **Council for Social Development**, a reputed institution focused on social science research. This collaboration is expected to provide students with applied research experience and opportunities to engage in policy-oriented internships.

Further, the department is also in dialogue with **Womenovator**, a platform that promotes women-led innovation and leadership, to develop avenues for student participation in **internship and research projects** that intersect with gender, governance, and development.

These proposed collaborations are aligned with the feedback suggestions and aim to strengthen the department's academic offerings, improve experiential learning opportunities, and ensure that the curriculum remains responsive to both student needs and contemporary academic standards.
