## **ABSTRACT**

The disintegration of the "Union of Soviet Socialist Republics" in 1991 created a vacuum in the Central Asian Republics. The geopolitical and geostrategic importance of Central Asia has made it possible for the two superpowers "China and the United States" to concentrate their attention on the region's economy. Central Asia is an abode to the wealth of oil, gas, uranium, coal and it is situated on the vital trade route connecting the West and the East. China, which is founded on a desire for strength, has to regain its dominance in its own backyard. This has been encored in the form of the BRI initiative, pipeline politics and the construction of nuclear reactors. These act as key instruments of influence dwindling in the security matters concerning that of Central Asia. It gives China an easy pathway to procure resources, leading to the exploitation of the Central Asian Region's abundant natural mineral resource wealth, endowing financial aid, and debt trap diplomacy.
