VOICES OF EQUALITY SDG 5 MEGA EVENT



26TH JULY 2025

CHRIST (Deemed to be University), Central Campus, emerged as the epicenter of a national-level discourse on gender empowerment through its landmark event, "Voices of Equality".

Organized under the banner of the United Nations Academic Impact (UNAI) Global SDG 5 Hub Chair, the event convened thought leaders from the corporate world, NGOs, academia, and civil society to accelerate action toward Sustainable Development Goal 5: Gender Equality.

- Creating clear reporting mechanisms and safe spaces in professional environments
- Building stronger alliances between academia, corporates, and NGOs to drive systemic change



This final session not only solidified the day's learnings but also transformed inspiration into actionable pathways. Participants left the room energized and equipped with a sense of shared responsibility—ready to take concrete steps toward making gender equality a reality in their own spheres of influence!







INTERACTIVE WRAP-UP



By facilitating this open exchange, Christ University ensured that the spirit of Voices of Equality extended beyond the stage—transforming connections into actionable collaborations that can drive real-world impact.

The informal setting allowed conversations to unfold organically, breaking down hierarchies and enabling participants to connect as equals. Students benefited from direct access to leaders in their fields, while professionals found fresh perspectives and inspiration from the next generation of changemakers.

This interactive exchange reinforced one of the core messages of Voices of Equality: progress is best achieved when individuals and institutions come together, share knowledge, and commit to collective action. The session concluded with the exchange of contact information, promises of future collaboration, and a renewed sense of shared purpose—ensuring that the connections made would continue to bear fruit long after the event.
