ABSTRACT

The thesis studies Erich Auerbach's emphasis on historicism in literary criticism, read alongside the deconstructive discourse on context. It studies Auerbach's "realism" as expressed in *Mimesis* and *Scenes from the Drama of European Literature*, collections of essays where Auerbach pursues his philological purpose of exploring literature's representative nature. In it, he surveys literature that has been predominantly written in Romance languages across centuries. The thesis also seeks to problematise the few categories used in Auerbach's essays, often interpreted as being of an *a priori* nature, using frameworks of law, exception and violence by Jacques Derrida and Giorgio Agamben. Such an analysis brings to light a "sovereign" voice in Auerbach, much like that of the Bible, which he contends inaugurated Western realism. Far from giving rise to ambiguity, the resulting theoretical richness of marrying a project of both representation and sovereignty can offer a unique way forward for the present literary and cultural scene.
