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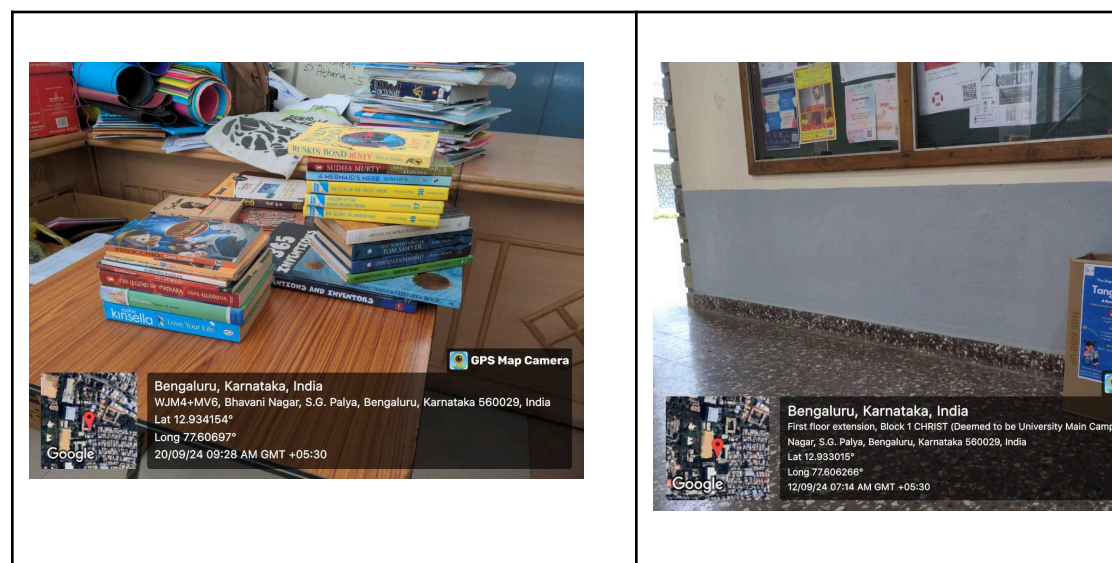
## REPORT

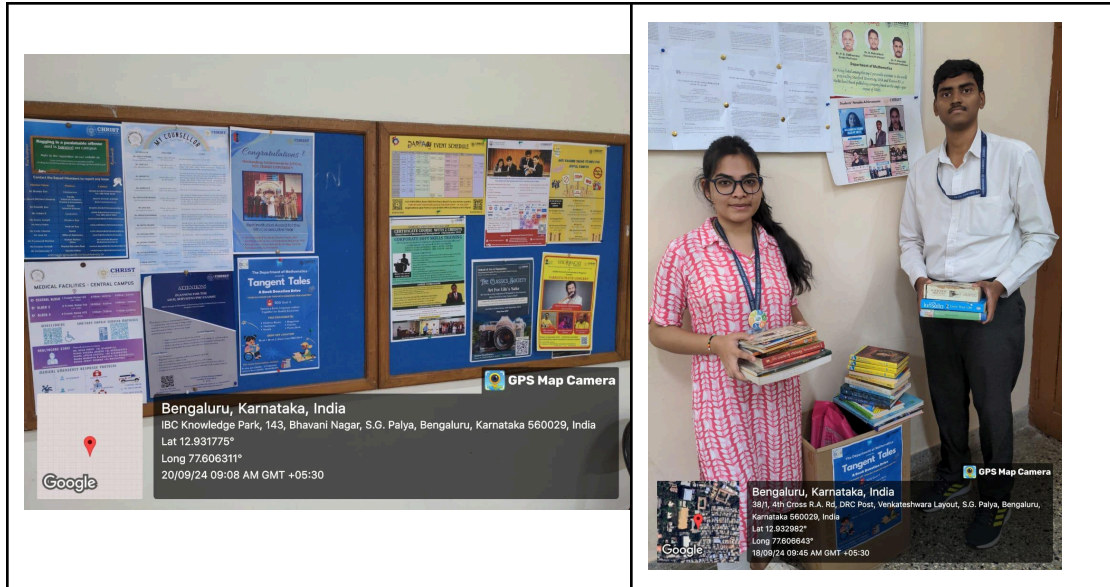
The Mathematics Department at CHRIST (Deemed to be University), Bangalore, in collaboration with the Centre for Social Action, (CSA) and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) Department, organized a donation drive to promote literacy and provide educational resources to underprivileged students. This initiative was aligned with SDG 4, which focuses on ensuring quality education and lifelong learning opportunities for all.

Led by SDG coordinators Ms. Sirisha Jain and Mr. Lakshmi Kant, under the guidance of Dr. Smita S Nagouda, the drive aimed to collect books from faculty, students, and staff. The collected books would be distributed to schools needing more educational materials. The organizers employed door-to-door promotion and social media outreach, generating significant participation from the campus community. Volunteers visited departments and dormitories to encourage donations, and posters and flyers helped raise further awareness.

The campaign successfully collected 30-35 books, including academic textbooks and storybooks suitable for different age groups. These donations were handed over to the CSA, which will oversee their distribution to local schools and educational centers in need, ensuring they reach underserved communities.

The donation drive provided educational resources and fostered a strong sense of social responsibility and collaboration on campus.
