National Workshop on Contract Drafting Skills 14/02/2024

Venue: Room 911, Central Block, CHRIST (Deemed to be University), Bangalore

No. of Participants: 84

The workshop on contract drafting and investment documentation provided students with a holistic understanding of the legal and commercial aspects of drafting transaction documents, including share purchase and subscription agreements. Through expert-led discussions, participants learned about funding stages, due diligence, and risk mitigation in investment contracts. The program emphasised precision, clarity, and fairness in legal drafting—principles that resonate with SDG 5's focus on equitable participation and responsible practices. The integrated drafting competition allowed students to apply their knowledge in real-world scenarios, promoting confidence, collaboration, and gender-inclusive engagement in legal education. The session empowered participants, particularly aspiring women professionals, to build expertise in commercial law and strengthen their representation in legal and financial domains.







1st National Symposium on Corporate Juris Nexus 29/09/2023

Venue: Online mode via Google Meet

No. of Participants: 64

The 1st National Symposium on Corporate Juris Nexus, held on 29th September, offered students a comprehensive insight into key areas of corporate law, including mergers and acquisitions, corporate restructuring, insolvency, banking, and finance. Experts discussed emerging trends, legal risks, and strategic approaches such as the "Poison Pill" defence against hostile takeovers. The session also emphasised the growing intersection of technology and law, highlighting cybersecurity considerations in corporate transactions. Through interactive discussions and case-based learning, participants gained critical analytical and practical skills relevant to the corporate legal sector. In alignment with SDG 5, the symposium encouraged inclusive participation, empowering women law students to build confidence, leadership, and expertise in corporate law—a traditionally male-dominated domain.







1st National Crime Scene Investigation Competition 2023 16/10/2023

Venue: CHRIST (Deemed to be University), Central Campus

No. of Participants: 139

The National Crime Scene Investigation Competition 2023–24, held on October 16, 2023, provided an immersive and intellectually stimulating platform for 34 teams from universities across India. Organised in collaboration with the Directorate of Forensic Science Laboratories, Government of Karnataka, the event emphasised teamwork, analytical reasoning, and unbiased investigation. Participants analysed eight simulated crime scenes, documented findings, and presented reports evaluated by forensic experts. The event was graced by Dr Divya V. Gopinath, Director of the State Forensic Science Laboratory, who encouraged equal participation of women in forensic and investigative sciences. Aligning with SDG 5 (Gender Equality), the competition fostered inclusive learning, empowering women scholars to excel in leadership, scientific analysis, and decision-making within the field of criminal justice.







Legal Craft: Advancing Advocacy Skills Week 03/04/2024 - 08/04/2024

The Legal Craft: Advancing Advocacy Skills Week 2023–2024, held from April 3–8, 2024, was an enriching initiative organised by the School of Law, CHRIST (Deemed to be University), in collaboration with the Constitutional Law Studies and Orientation Committee, Human Rights Committee, and Gender Studies Committee. The week featured diverse activities such as a Legal Drafting Workshop, a Judgment Rewriting Competition, a Constitutional Debate, and a Panel Discussion. Notably, the judgment rewriting competition encouraged students to reinterpret landmark cases through a feminist legal lens, addressing gender biases in judicial reasoning. Guest speakers Adv. Jaibatruka Mohanta, Adv. Aditya Krishna Pandey, and Adv. Anirudh Kulkarni shared valuable advocacy insights. Alumni Sports Meet 2023-24 17/03/2024


Venue: Conference Room, A Block, Bangalore Yeshwanthpur Campus

As part of promoting gender inclusivity and awareness, the students of 3 MA English with Communication Studies set up a gender awareness stall titled "Beyond the Binary: Gender Identities Unboxed" on 2 November 2023, under the Inclusivity Cell. The initiative sought to create an engaging, educational, and empathetic space for students to learn, unlearn, and converse about diverse gender identities. Interactive games such as "Myth Buster" and "Glossary of Gender Terms" helped participants challenge misconceptions, understand key terminologies, and foster open dialogue about gender diversity. The Comment Section provided a platform for students to share their perspectives, experiences, and feedback—many expressing support for inclusivity, self-acceptance, and normalisation of all genders. No. of Participants: 60



Venue: Room No. 505, 5th floor, Central Block, Christ



Aligned with SDG 1 - No Poverty, the session focused on how integrated food security initiatives can serve as powerful tools for poverty reduction in India. The discussion explored the impact of key government programmes such as the Public Distribution System (PDS), Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) and PM POSHAN in ensuring affordable and nutritious food for the country's most vulnerable populations.

Speakers emphasised the importance of strengthening rural food systems through sustainable agriculture, increased access to nutrition-rich foods and the use of digital innovations to enhance transparency and delivery. Venue: Seminar Hall Block C **No. of Participants:** 123




Guest Lecture on "Fostering equality and empathy: Embracing gender sensitisation for a better world" 08/07/2023

Gender, Law and Elections 08/07/2024





Venue: Garden Street, in front of Central Block



Advocacy Awareness Skill Development 05/02/2024



Venue: Room 101, Block 4, Central Campus, Bengaluru



Menstrual Equity Awareness Programme 30/10/2023

The Menstrual Equity Awareness Programme was conducted on 30 October 2023 by the II MA English with Communication Studies students as part of their Gender Studies CIA 3. Held from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. in the Science Lab of St. Helen's School, the session aimed to sensitise students of classes 7 and 8 about menstruation and promote menstrual equity. Through an interactive PowerPoint presentation, the presenters explained menstruation, hormones, and bodily processes in simple terms. They dispelled myths, encouraged open conversations, and highlighted hygiene practices, including the correct use and disposal of sanitary napkins. The session also addressed respect and empathy toward menstruating individuals. It concluded with the distribution of sanitary napkins to teachers, earning appreciation from both students and school staff for its informative and inclusive approach.





Menstrual Leave Policy in the Workplace 05/03/2024

The Gender Studies Committee organised an insightful skit on menstrual leave policy, serving as an introduction to a Labour Department discussion on the topic. The performance depicted the challenges menstruating employees face in workplaces, particularly due to discriminatory attitudes from employers and colleagues. Through a simulated mediation session, the skit highlighted constitutional, legal, and international perspectives on menstrual leave, encouraging constructive dialogue between employees and employers. The performance aimed to debunk myths, promote inclusivity, and demonstrate how mediation can help develop fair and feasible workplace policies. 


Nukkad Natak: 1 in every 5 Women, Let's Break the Silence 01/09/2023



10 Women Directors' Play Productions 19/04/2023 - 20/04/2023





Workshop on "Granville Austin and the Making of India's Constitution 11/08/2023




Exploring the contours of the doctrine of Basic Structure 27/07/2023







Workshop on 'Writs-Bridging the Gap between Theory and Practice 25/08/2023




Demographic Dividend: Is it a boon or a bane for India 11/07/2024

DEIB Expert Talk: Inclusion of People with Disabilities at the Workplace 28/08/2024


