## Soft Skill Training Program for I BSc(EMS)



From being a huge entity, the world has shrunk into a global village. Even more scintillating is that the change has just begun. To help the students become a part of this path breaking change, the department of Mathematics organized a special orientation for the first year BSc(Economics, Mathematics and Statistics) students. In the orientation various presentations and activities were held.

Through these activities the students not only learnt team building skills but also important values to ensure proper utilization of the resources (offered by University) and to lead a successful life. The department have taken a considerable step in ensuring that the students understand how to learn rather than starting with the course directly. They have made sure that all the students form a healthy bond before they embark on their 3 year journey in Christ (Deemed to be University).

The orientation started off with a small Power point presentation with the theme "If you are fit in class, you are fit in life". The purpose of this presentation was to make the students understand the need to adapt in different environments which can be implemented in real life situation. Adaptability in the workplace is when an employee can be flexible and have the ability to adapt to changing work conditions. An adaptable employee can work independently or work well with a team. Working in a group is helpful for employees to brainstorm ideas or to create an excellent product. The most important thing is to never stop learning and this workshop inculcated a number of core values that we will be able to carry throughout all future endeavors in our lives.

The first activity organized was to develop our team work skills and taught us how to cooperate with a group of people with different ideas, perspectives and backgrounds. Students were told to demonstrate the working of any machine using their own abilities and s4ynchronization through which the coordination and cooperation of the students was evident. This helped build up team spirit and helped students realize that a task to succeed requires many people working in cooperation by pooling together the resources and talents of





The next activity was to make us understand that there are different kinds of individuals and the two major kinds were compared to that of a coke bottle and a bottle of water. A coke bottle represents those who usually tends to lose their calm during chaotic situations whereas a water bottle remains calm throughout a situation of any sort and decide to stay patient. Patience is very important in life because there are so many things that take time to develop for us to experience in a positive way. Another thing we learnt is we should always be optimistic through any situation but just because you can find lots of reasons for feeling down and becoming a bona fide pessimist doesn't mean that you should. An optimist will see it as a glass half full and a pessimist will see it as a glass half empty. Expecting good things to happen will lead to taking actions that produce positive results. The third activity involved building paper towers which prohibited the use of articles such as cello tape or staple pins but the actual challenge was to make sure the tower withstands the wind blown by 5 students of the other groups at a distance of 5 ft. We noticed that the towers which had a strong base withstood any amount of wind that was blown at them. This was because they had a strong base which teaches us that life will throw many problems at us and we will be able to overcome them only if our base which constitutes our core values is strong. Most of the students aimed at building the tallest paper tower which wasn't the intention of the activity. Similarly, instead of reaching the peak in life we should aim at keeping our base strong. Just like our first prime minister, Late Jawaharlal Nehru. He not only aimed at reaching the peak by his hard work but stayed in touch with his core values and made sure his base was strong throughout his life.

In the fourth activity, we were given a piece of paper as a group and were told to divide it into the no. of pieces as the number of members in the group and individually, we were given the authority to divide our own pieces of paper into the number of our choice. After this, we were told to put the piece of paper in the same condition as we got it, which we all know is impossible. Here, the torn paper shows that the consequences of our actions. We've come across many people usually telling us how a broken glass cannot be put back in the same way it was before which tells us that no matter what, all are actions have consequences be it good or bad.
